REPORT ON A FIVE DAY SPOKEN ENGLISH COURSE

Introduction

The PG Department of English, in association with the Emerald Association, organised a Five Day Course on "**Spoken English**" from **23.06.2026 to 30.06.2026** at the Conference Hall of Bon Secours Arts and Science College for Women, Dindigul. The programme was designed to strengthen the English communication skills of students by improving their grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation, fluency, and confidence in speaking. The course adopted an interactive and activity-based approach to enable students to communicate effectively in academic, professional, and social contexts.

The programme was conducted in the presence of **Rev. Dr. NesaSoundram, Secretary**, and **Dr. S. Gayathri, Principal**. The keynote address was delivered by **Rev. Fr. Paulsamy, SDB, Administrator, Don Bosco ITI, Madurai**, who motivated the students to develop effective communication skills for personal and professional success.

Objectives

- To enhance students' spoken English and communication skills.
- To improve confidence and fluency in speaking English.
- To strengthen grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation, and sentence formation.
- To develop interpersonal, presentation, and public speaking skills.
- To prepare students for interviews, higher education, and professional communication.
- To encourage active participation in English conversations through practical activities.

Day – 1 (23.06.2026 – Tuesday)

A Five Day Spoken English Course commenced successfully with enthusiastic participation from students of all departments. The sessions were handled by **Rev. Fr. Paulsamy, SDB, Ms. M. Vennila**, and **Mrs. N. Nishadheenu** according to the group-wise schedule. Rev. Fr. Paulsamy introduced the fundamentals of the English language, including **Letters, Words and Sentences** and **Kinds of Sentences**. Ms. M. Vennila explained **Nouns, Pronouns, and Conversation Skills**, while Mrs. N. Nishadheenu introduced **Prepositions** through simple examples and interactive classroom activities. Students actively participated in self-introduction exercises, pair conversations, and speaking activities that helped them overcome hesitation and build confidence.

Day – 2 (24.06.2026 – Wednesday)

On the second day, the training focused on strengthening grammar and sentence construction. **Rev. Fr. Paulsamy** taught **Parts of Speech** and **Tenses**, enabling students to understand the correct usage of English in daily communication. **Ms. M. Vennila** explained **Possessive Nouns, Adjectives, Adverbs, and Articles**, while **Mrs. N. Nishadheenu** covered **Conjunctions, Interjections, and Auxiliaries**. Grammar exercises, vocabulary-building activities, pronunciation practice, and group discussions made the sessions highly interactive and beneficial.

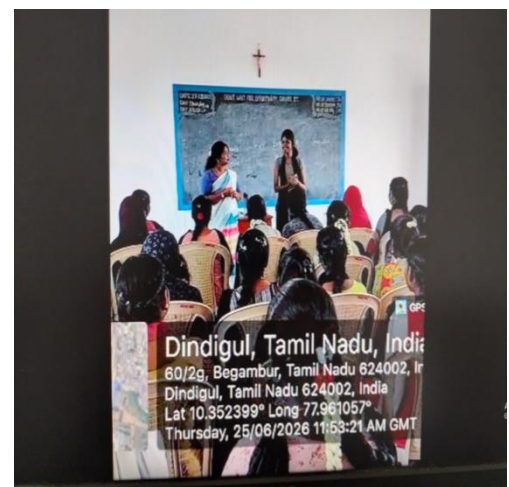
DAY – 2 (24.06.2026 – WEDNESDAY)



Day – 3 (25.06.2026 – Thursday)

The third day's sessions concentrated on developing fluency and communication skills through practical learning. **Rev. Fr. Paulsamy** explained **Active and Passive Voice**, **Direct and Indirect Speech**, and **Vocabulary Usage** with relevant examples. **Ms. M. Vennila** conducted conversation practice sessions, while **Mrs. N. Nishadheenu** handled **Question Tags** and **Story Telling** activities. Students enthusiastically participated in role plays, dialogue presentations, storytelling, and situational conversations, which significantly improved their speaking confidence.

The fourth day emphasised practical communication and personality development. **Rev. Fr. Paulsamy, Ms. M. Vennila, and Mrs. N. The final day focused on revision and reinforcement of all the topics covered during the course. **Rev. Fr. Paulsamy, Ms. M. Vennila, and Mrs. N. Nishadheenu** conducted revision sessions on grammar, vocabulary, sentence formation, conversation, and communication skills through interactive activities and language games. Students demonstrated remarkable improvement in their spoken English through presentations and speaking exercises. The programme concluded with the Valedictory Function, during which students presented a skit, shared their valuable feedback, and expressed their gratitude to the management and the resource persons for conducting an enriching and meaningful training programme.
